



Tips for Preparing your Dogs for Evacuation

Planning: Have a plan where you would take your dogs in an emergency. Both KCC Park and the Bulla grounds are available during emergencies for people wishing to stay with their dogs.

Identification: Make sure microchips are working when scanned and all details are up to date on the microchip database and on council registration.

Information: It is a good idea to make up an information sheet for each of your dogs in case you need to leave them with someone else during an evacuation (example attached). Alternatively you can attach a tag to their collar with a QR tag that contains all their information. Have all important pedigree certificates, health testing paperwork, semen certificates, owner agreements etc organised and easily accessible to be taken with you. It may be

easier to put some of this information onto electronic storage devices or stored on the cloud to minimise the amount you need to pack.

Supplies: Pack enough food, water and medications for your dogs for several days.

Equipment: Collars, leads, water and food bowls, important toys +/- crates as needed for your dogs. If you have multiple dogs you can also have individually coloured collars to identify each dog, dogs in season, dogs with medical/behavioural needs etc and note this on their information sheet.
